#### Minutes of the Salt Lake Astronomical Society

#### SPOC Advisory Committee Meeting, 07 November 2009

Committee Chair Ken Harris called the meeting to order in the Denny's restaurant located at 250 West 500 South in SLC at 1:44 p.m. Others in attendance were committee members Dave Bernson, Bruce Grim, Wayne Clarke, Mark Bloomenthal, Roger Butz, Bill Kennedy, Boyd McNeil, and Patrick Wiggins and SLAS members Siegfried Jachmann, Bruno Jachmann, Kevin Hays and David Hays.

Roger was nominated for another 3 year term. Ken was nominated to continue to serve as chair through the end of 2010 (both actions subject to approval by the SLAS board). The committee members and the expiration dates of their terms are now:

The Ealing focuser is broken. Dave Bernson will investigate a new one. Since this is a maintenance item the cost should come from the SPOC fund.

The committee agreed the following equipment should be purchased and will ask the SLAS board / membership for permission to purchase with general funds:
Two 40mm Astro Tech Titan 2 eyepieces, \$160 each (one for the Ealing, one for the Bogdan).
One 30mm Astro Tech Titan 2 eyepiece for the Ealing (\$160).

One Ultra Block nebula filter for the Ealing (from Bill Kennedy for \$69). Two polarizing filters, \$65 each (one for the Ealing, one for the Bogdan).

Future SPOC training, especially initial training, is to cover how to reserve the observatory online.

After hearing about several problems telescope users have experienced using the equipment (because of not being current) it was decided those wishing to use the observatory scopes must first attend a mandatory refresher class each year on each scope they wish to operate.

The observatory will be available for training starting 01 March, weather permitting. It will open for general use beginning 01 April.

Mark will work with SLAS Webmaster Ken Warner to update the SPOC related portions of the club's website. Updates will include:

- 1) Adding the SPOC General Policies and Procedures.
- 2) Adding the ability to document when each operator has completed the now mandatory annual refresher class on the Ealing and Bogdan (this capability already exists for the Grim).
- 3) Adding the "Red Light Policy" to the SPOC General Policies and Procedures.

The committee will suggest to the board that a special "Mars Opposition Watch" using only the Bogdan be held the night of 12 February with a rain date of the following night.

The 2010 SPOC fee will remain \$25.00.

Roger noted that some members have reserved more than one SPOC scope at a time even though that's a violation of SPOC policy. Roger will check with the webmaster to see about making it so that operators may only use the website to reserve one scope at a time.

Dave will see about framing and hanging some star lists in the observatory bays.

The committee thought it would be a great idea to frame and hang a set of the University of Arizona's Lunar Quadrant Maps in the Refractor House. However, the maps are apparently long out of print. Committee members will see if a set can be located.

Mark will investigate ways of changing the brightness of the Grim's computer monitor.

It's difficult for some SPOC Committee members to attend Saturday afternoon meetings. Future committee meetings will be held on midweek evenings.

The date(s) of the next SPOC Advisory Committee meeting(s) will be set at next month's Transitional Board meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:30 p.m.

In addition to the above SLAS will also support the annual Bryce Canyon Astronomy Festival to be held 07-10 July. SLAS will also hold a private star party for the residents of Stansbury Park (home of the club's observatory) at SPOC on Saturday, 21 August as part of the community's Stansbury Days celebration.

Setting the schedule early makes it possible to get the star party fliers printed for free.

Dave offered to chair SLAS's 2010 Astronomy Day committee. Offer accepted. The committee will coordinate SLAS's Astronomy Day activities with other organizations. Members wishing to serve on the committee should contact Dave.

It was noted that the Astronomical League has scheduled the April 2010 Astronomy Day to coincide with the full Moon. SLAS will hold its Astronomy Day events on the first of May when the Moon will not be a problem.

The SPOC Advisory Committee had asked about spending General funds on SPOC. Following a lengthy discussion it was decided that General funds can only be spent on SPOC in an emergency. Since no emergency exists the purchases currently being considered (eyepieces and filters) must come from the SPOC account.

Ann reported that all is set for this year's Solstice Festival at Golden Corral in Midvale and that she will be issuing a SLAS blast to remind members about the event. In addition to tips that members would normally leave, SLAS will give an additional \$100.

Bruce announced that Observatory Training Director Wayne Clarke had asked to be relieved of his duties and that Mark Bloomenthal had agreed to take over the position (a position Mark has held before). The board and all others present expressed appreciation to Wayne for the great job he's done.

Bruce said the parts to repair the Grim Scope's electronics have been received and that they will be installed before the observatory reopens early next year.

Ann said the club still has several SLAS patches for sale for \$4 each. Anyone wanting a patch should contact Ann.

#### General Meeting, 17 November 2009

SLAS President Dave Bernson called the meeting to order in room 105 of the University of Utah's Engineering/Mines building at 7:35 p.m. Approximately 48 people attended the meeting.

After the usual introduction of board members and new members Dave introduced the evening's speaker Wayne Springer from the U of U's department of Physics and Astronomy. Wayne spoke about the U's new observatory on Frisco Peak in Southern Utah. Wayne noted that the U will consider proposals from SLAS to station equipment at the site and that SLAS will have online access.

Motions were made and passed to spend ZAP funds for a 12" Sky Quest Dobsonian and a Coronado PST 40mm solar scope and mount. An additional motion passed to spend up to \$500 from general funds to supplement the scope purchases if needed.
